### **Parents' sessions**

It was fantastic to see such a turn out of parents to our class Maths sessions last week, especially in Early Years (37%) and Key Stage 1 (55%) and Key Stage 2 (18%). How lovely to see parents and carers 'having a go' and learning with your child! Children are always so happy to learn and it was nice that you were able to share this with them.

### **Class assemblies**

Both 1M and 4J performed wonderful assemblies this January, each class sharing their topics with the rest of the school and their parents. Miss Jackson's class are studying Egypt at the moment so we were able to go back in time and learn about mummies, the pyramids and pharaohs. ### **Medical issues**

We regularly update our medical records in order to keep on top of all children's medical conditions. If there is a change of medication, a new medication, asthma pump or other please ensure that you inform the office straight away and we can do the necessary paper work. Remember, pumps and Epipens do have an expiry date, so please keep an eye on these. If your child has a specific medical condition and a Healthcare Plan has not been completed with Mrs Ofield our Inclusion Manager, then please contact the office so that we can make an appointment.

We have quite an accumulation of medicines in our first aid cupboard in the main office. If you have left any Calpol or similar that is no longer needed please come and pick it. Any unclaimed or out of date medicine will need to be disposed of. Thank you.

### **Asthma Pumps**

At this time of year, as you know we all get coughs and colds. Please ensure that if your child is a bit under the weather with a cold, and usually has an asthma pump to use, ensure they bring their pump with them to school.



### **Dressing warmly**



Please ensure that your child is dressed with enough warm clothes: a school jumper for indoors and a warm coat, hat, scarf and gloves for coming to and from school and to wear outside during morning and lunch time breaks. Remember, boots can be worn to and from school but children must change into their plain black shoes when they arrives.

### **Outside the school**

It has been brought to our attention from local residents that some parents are still parking on zebra crossings etc. Also, people have been emptying their cars' rubbish and ashtrays onto the ground whilst waiting for their children. Please act with consideration for others.

## **Uniform**

We are delighted that so many children are wearing the correct school uniform and shoes, however, there are still a minority who aren't in the correct attire. Please make use of the holidays to sort out the correct uniform.
