Please check the kit list and if there is something that you are finding difficult to get please inform the class teachers or office sooner rather than later. Equally, all medical forms, contracts and transport (for year 5 only) forms need to be handed back to the office asap please. Children have such a fantastic time on residential trips and it is really the celebration of their learning and year together, it is truly a unforgettable experience for them!

# Leave of absence from school during term time

If you consider taking your child out of school during term time, for whatever reason, it is necessary to fill in an application form. This form must be submitted at least 14 days prior to the date you wish to remove your child.

It is only in exceptional circumstances that this may be authorised.

If the time you request is not authorised and you still take your child out of school we will have to notify the Behaviour & Attendance Team and they may issue you with a Penalty Notice. The penalty is issued to each parent for each child taken out of school. This is a fine of £60 which increases to £120 if not paid within the first 28 days. Non payment of the fine may result in legal action.

Please note that Brighton and Hove Council have lengthened the October half term holiday from one week to two (16th - 27th October) and our school will be holding its last two Inset days on Monday 24th and Tuesday 25th July, allowing the children to break up on Friday 21st July, enabling holiday bookings within a cheaper period.

# Book Fair

Once again, the Scholastic Book Fair was a big success and it was so nice to see so many parent/carers with their children browsing through the books and choosing a book together. We raised £328 in free books for our school thanks to your support.

# Class Photo Day

Class photo day went without a hitch and photos will be coming home soon with your child so you may order one if you wish.
