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Dear Parents and Carers,

Teacher Applications

There will be some very minor staff changes at Bevendean Primary School from September, 2017. We have recently advertised for a new teacher for next year and received 27 applications in total! Bevendean is a popular school and teachers want to come and work here! Many of the teachers who came to visit commented on the wonderful behaviour and attitude of our pupils– thank you for sending such lovely children to our school!

Upcoming Events

1. Year 6 SATS Tests - our Year 6 children, who have worked so incredibly hard this year will be sitting their SATS tests the week beginning Monday 8th May. Thank you to all parents and carers who have also supported them with their learning throughout the year too. We wish them all well and know that they will do their best – celebrating the learning over their primary school years.

2. English 'Parent/Carers' Sessions' - our termly parents' session will take place on Tuesday 16th May from 9.00am – 9.30am for Nursery – Year 1 parents and on Thursday 18th May form 9.00am – 9.30am for Year 3 – 6 parents. The focus this time will be English.

* Please note: Year 2's Parents' Session will take place on the same day, but from 2.35pm – 3.05pm due a timetable clash.

3. Whole School Picnic - hopefully you have already made a note of this event! Friday 26th May – the last day of term. Join us for a whole school picnic! This will be our termly 'House Event' and brothers, sisters and families will all be able to sit and eat together! The upper school gates will open for parents at 1.00pm. Parents/carers may take their children home from 2.00pm on this day if they wish. However, the school is still open, so children whose parents/carers are unable to attend will stay until the end of the day as they would do normally.



2017 - 2018 Arrangements

After the half term break, we will be notifying parents and carers of who their child's teacher will be for next year. There will also be some minor changes to the classes in some year groups. A separate letter will be sent home in due course.

Music/Drama Program



All classes at Bevendean now receive a weekly / drama lesson from our dynamic and creative music specialist, Anna Jewett, on a half term rota. Her lessons link to the class topic and involves music: sing-ing, playing instruments, and composing. This is part of the school's commitment to provide a broad and balanced curriculum for our children.

October - Half Term 2017

Many parents are not taking advantage of the fact that Brighton and Hove have changed the dates for the October 2017 half-term; this has been scheduled as a two-week break instead of one! This is a trial initiative by the council so that parents can book an affordable holiday outside term time. Please take advantage of this and think about booking your holiday for these dates. Please check the school's website for information on the Council's policy and guidance on holidays during term time.

Spring Term Winning House

The winning House for last term was Pavilion House. The points have been incredibly close in recent weeks! For the last weekly total before Easter, there was only 10 points between 1st and 4th place. The final points for the whole Spring Term were: West Pier 7,225; **i360** 7,241; **Palace Pier** 7,363 and the winning house, **Pavilion** with 7,506! Children receive house points for wearing full school uniform, demonstrating an understanding of the school rules and showing commitment to their learn-



ing and work. Well done everyone!

Communication with the School

We encourage parents & carers to come in and speak with us if they have any concerns about anything that has happened at school. In all cases, parents leave the school happy after speaking with us. However, in a very small number of cases, rather than speak with the school, a few voice their concerns via social media or to others. School Parking

It is so nice to see so many parents getting their children to school on time and every day. Although it has been brought to my attention that some parents are parking in places that could potentially be dangerous to our children (on pedestrian crossings and zig zagged areas). Please could I suggest that you take an extra 5 minutes to arrive in time to find a safe space to park. Also, please do not use the staff car park at drop-off and pick-up times. There are disabled parking bays only for those who are authorised to use them. Thank you for your consideration and cooperation.



School Funding

In March, you would have received a letter from our Partnership about School Funding (<u>http://bevendean.eschools.co.uk/website/march 2017/267852</u>). This stated that school budgets have been under pressure for some time and these pose on-going pressure for school leaders resulting in tough decisions having to be made in the future about the way schools are run. The increased costs incurred at Bevendean Primary School have not been offset by the changes to the new funding formula for schools.

Although our income per child has stayed roughly the same, increased costs in all areas and a slight reduction in our school numbers (the number of children on roll) mean that in time, we will have less money to run the school. We are able to meet a portion of this increase using our 'carry-forward' from this year's budget and by making savings in a number of other areas. However, this, in time, may not be enough. As there will be additional cuts and savings that will have to be made. Some of these may be:

- a reduction in the amount the school has to spent of curriculum resources and staff professional development
- _ a reduction in the amount of support that special needs pupils receive and the additional interventions we provide

- not funding school trips and residential trips (school trips have received a subsidy of 50% this year)

- a reduction in the number of staff we are able to employ to work with your children

Some of these things will have to happen in order for the school to 'balance the books' in coming years. The message to the government is so important and your much needed and appreciated support is so vital. Please contact and lobby your local MP.



ParentPay

As you know our school has been cashless for over 2 years now. Please remember to pay items like school trips, swimming and dinners via our system ParentPay. If you are having difficulties using ParentPay, at any time, Debbie in the main school office is always happy to help you. If you are new to the school and don't have log on details, please also contact the office.

For school dinners, credit is not permitted, so please do not allow this account to get overdrawn, as this is linked directly to the council and Eden, our Catering provider. As I am sure you can understand chasing non payments causes lots of extra work behind the scenes.

Residential Trips for Years 5 & 6

5WD will be going to their residential trip to Parkwood from Monday 12th June to Wednesday 14th June and 5W will be going on Wednesday 14th June staying until Friday 16th June. Not everyone has yet paid for this, so please do finalise your child's payment as soon as possible. Kit lists, medical forms, contracts and travelling arrangement forms have come home. Please fill out forms and ensure that they have come back to us. If you need any help getting the kit list together please contact the school asap.

Year 6 are going to Blackland Farm from Tuesday 4th July to Friday 7th July. If you have asked for funding we will be keeping you informed of the decision as soon as we hear. Otherwise full payment is now due. All paper work needs to come back to the class teacher asap too. Likewise any help needed for the kit list, do not wait to the last minute to ask.
