Results from Bevendean Primary and Nursery - Safe and Well at School Survey 2021

Below are the results from the school's Safe and Well at School Survey which was completed in conjunction with Anti-Bullying Week ($15^{th} - 19^{th}$ November, 2021). The survey was completed by our Year 4 – Year 6 children, which totalled 124 responses.

Below is a summary of the results from the 2021 Safe & Well at School Survey.

Children who have a trusted adult at school	97%
Children who have a trusted adult at home	98%
Children who enjoy being at school	92%
Children who enjoy learning at school	90%
Children who feel safe at school	98%
Children who feel they belong in the school	95%
Children who feel proud to part of Bevendean school	98%
Children who feel that adults and children treat each other with respect at Bevendean	100%
Children who believe behaviour is good in class	99%
Children who believe behaviour is good in the playground	95%
Children who feel that their pupils are caring towards each other	99%
Children who feel that adults are caring towards children	99%
Children who feel supported to get on with others from different backgrounds	97%
Children who have one or more good friends at school	99%
Children who believe there isn't much bullying at our school	96%
Children who identify as having been a victim of bullying in school this academic year	0%
Children who identify as being a perpetrator of bullying in school this academic year	0%
Children who feel safe when out and about in the neighbourhood, alone or with friends	81%

















After analysing the information form the 2021 Safe & Well at School Survey, our focus is to:

- support our pupils to build positive relationships with adults so all children feel they have a trusted member of staff.
- We will continue our ongoing work with regards to bullying and behaviour on the playground.
- As the data was produced and analysed in school, we were able to identify individual children who need support around specific areas, for example, gender, young carers, low self-esteem etc.
- Support around these issues will be ongoing.
